

Water Quality Monitoring Accident Management Plan – West Maui

This information should be disseminated to all surveyors and all water quality support personnel operating in the area of west Maui. These procedures should be followed in response to an emergency.

LIFE THREATENING CONDITIONS | EMERGENCY RESPONSE

1) Call for Help

2) **During the Emergency Call**

Listen carefully and do exactly what the dispatcher asks you to do.

Be prepared to provide the emergency dispatcher with the following information:

- **Your location** – approximate GPS coordinates

3) Provide Emergency Care – First Response

While waiting for emergency personnel to arrive, administer First Aid or CPR.

- o Evaluate airway, breathing and circulation (ABCs) and initiate CPR if necessary.
- o Keep the victim comfortable and supine. If able and not experiencing an altered level of consciousness, have the victim drink water. Guard against exposure, and monitor for shock.
- o If person is conscious, look to see if they are alert (with eyes open), verbal (responding to simple questions and instructions), responsive to pain (if no verbal activity, is the victim reactive to a pinch?), or unresponsive.

4) Record Information

- o Record time of accident, signs and symptoms, pallor, and observations.
- o Locate the person's Emergency Contact Info in the First Aid Kit Backpack and have readily available.
- o After the emergency has passed, fill out an Injury/Illness Incident Report Form found in the First Aid Kit Backpack.

NON - LIFE THREATENING CONDITIONS | EMERGENCY RESPONSE

1) Non-Life Threatening Emergency Response

For non-life threatening conditions (e.g. sprains, minor allergies, a wound needing stitches, etc.) **call your Volunteer Coordinator** or the TNC Project Manager to alert them to the situation

2) Provide Emergency Care - First Response

- o Transport the victim to the medical care facility nearest your current location.
- o For a conservative approach, take the victim to Maui Memorial Hospital in Kahului which can accommodate most healthcare needs, especially in the instance a non-life threatening emergency becomes life-threatening. Otherwise, the clinics and facilities nearest you may serve you well.
- o If driving to a clinic, have a team member call the clinic's number to see if they can manage your current non-life threatening emergency situation. If not, go to the nearest hospital.

3) Record Information

- o Locate the victim's Volunteer Waiver in the First Aid Kit Backpack and have Emergency Contact Info readily available.
- o After the emergency has passed, fill out an Injury/Illness Incident Report Form found in the First Aid Kit Backpack.
